THE LITTLE WHITE CAT

A long, long time ago, in a valley far away, a giant lived in a great castle, surrounded by trees that were always green. THE BEST ANIMATED FILMS

Speaker 1

I was a teenager when I first watched *The Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs*. It follows the basic story of a popular fairy tale and is still popular with younger children. Speaker 6
